

CMS Framework for Advancing Health Care in Rural, Tribal, and Geographically Isolated Communities

Rural Health Overview

Rural communities comprise vast and varied landscapes that encompass micropolitan, frontier, and tribal lands, as well as U.S. territories and other island communities. In the United States, approximately one in five Americans reside in a rural, tribal, or geographically isolated (RTGI) community. These communities, made up of more than 67 million people, produce much of the nation's drinking water, food, and energy, and they have vibrant cultural heritages and strong community ties. Despite their economic and cultural importance, RTGI communities face challenges accessing essential health services and adequate health insurance coverage, which contribute to poor health outcomes and health disparities. Addressing the geographic barriers that can limit access to services and resources is important to help everyone attain their highest level of health.
