Hospice Quality Reporting Program (HQRP) – Important Reminders and Updates

Annual Payment Update Reminders

FY 2027 Hospice Quality Reporting Reminder

For hospices to meet the HQRP requirements, both the Hospice Item Set (HIS) and the Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS®) Hospice Survey must be submitted timely each year. Data collection for the Calendar Year (CY) 2025 began on January 1, 2025, and impacts your Annual Payment Update (APU) for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2027. Beginning with FY 2024, hospices that fail to meet HQRP requirements face a 4% payment penalty.

- **Hospice assessment**: The threshold for HIS is 90%. This means that 90% of all HIS assessments must be submitted to and accepted by CMS within 30 days of the admission or discharge date. For HIS assessments, the reporting periods are based on the submission of HIS admission or discharge assessments between 1/1/2025-9/30/2025, whereas HOPE is scheduled to begin reporting on 10/1/2025.
- Consumer Assessments of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS®): All Medicare-certified hospices required to conduct the CAHPS® Hospice Survey must contract with an approved CAHPS® Hospice Survey vendor and conduct the survey for a 12-month period each calendar year. For more information on CAHPS® Hospice Survey requirements, please visit the survey website: www.hospicecahpssurvey.org. The data collection quarters for CAHPS® are based on patient deaths occurring between 1/1/2025-12/31/2025, inclusive.

- Claims: Administrative data collected from claims, and hospices are automatically considered 100% compliant upon submission of this data.

Provider-initiated requests for exemption or extension for extraordinary circumstances:

If a hospice experiences an extraordinary circumstance, it can initiate a request for an extension or exemption. *Requests must be initiated within 90 days of the extraordinary circumstances event* and must be sent to CMS via email following the instructions provided on the Extension and Exemption Requests webpage.

How to Update Hospice Demographic Data

- The **How to Update Hospice Demographic Data** is available to help hospice providers with correcting demographic data. Here is a link to the page: <u>How to Update Demographic Data</u>
 - Hospice providers should regularly review their reports to verify that their demographic data
 is accurate. The **Provider Preview Reports** reflect the quality measure data and hospice
 demographic information that will be posted to <u>Care Compare</u> in the following quarter.
 - O If any demographic information is incorrect, the hospice provider must complete the CMS-855A form in PECOS with the updated demographic information. Afterward, request your Medicare Administrative Contractor (MAC) to send the completed form to the appropriate State Agency with a request to update the demographic data in the Internet Quality Improvement Evaluation System (iQIES).
 - Please note that updates to demographic data do not happen in real time and can take up to 6 months to appear on Care Compare.
- The HQRP Quarterly Q&A for Q3 2024 is now available. This Q&A includes a selected questions received by the Hospice Quality Help Desk during the first quarter of 2024 (July 1 to September 30, 2024). Introducing the HOPE Tool Web-Based Training

Public Reporting Updates

The current refresh of Hospice Care Compare data was in August of 2024. Provider Preview Reports for the August Refresh were released in February 2024.

CAHPS® Hospice Survey

The CAHPS® Hospice Survey continues to collect data. The data submission deadlines for the CAHPS® Data Warehouse are on the second Wednesday of the month in February, May, August, and November. Vendors must receive patient/caregiver lists on time to meet the requirements for the HQRP.

HOPE Update

On August 6, 2024, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued a final rule pdf (CMS-1810-F) that provides updates to the fiscal year (FY) 2025 Hospice Quality Reporting Program (HQRP). This rule clarifies current policy related to the "election statement" and the "notice of election", as well as to add clarifying language regarding hospice certification. The rule also clarifies the implementation of collecting and submitting HOPE data as of October 1, 2025. The HOPE Guidance Manual and HOPE QM User Manual are available on the HOPE webpage in the **Downloads** section.
