## **Personal Care and Support Services**



## Message

Medicaid may be able to help people who have a hard time doing chores and everyday activities at home due to diagnosed physical or mental conditions.

If you are eligible for Medicaid, and your doctor orders these services, you may be able to get personal care and support services at home. Personal care services help with activities like eating, bathing, and dressing. You may also be able to get help with making meals, light housework, and shopping for clothes and food.[1, 2]

You will have a case manager who will help make sure you get the services you need.[3]



Follow these tips to avoid mistakes while receiving personal care services:

- Review your paperwork so there are no mistakes and ask for a copy;
- Make sure your service plan is current and reviewed at least once a year;
- Keep all of your information up to date;
- Choose a qualified helper; and
- Write down when you receive services, note the date, the service, and the person who rendered it, and keep a copy.
